ATTENDANCE LETTERS

The Education Welfare Officer made her regular visit to review attendance registers this week. Pleasingly, there has been an improvement in the attendance of the majority of children who received letters last term. We will, however, be sending out some new or further letters to parents where attendance is now a cause for concern.

Although our overall attendance is similar to the current national levels we remain concerned about the percentage of pupils who are considered as Persistent absentees. (less than 90% attendance). The vast majority of these are due to unauthorised absence for holidays during term time which.

DOODLEMATHS



Doodlemaths is the main tool we provide for maths homework for pupils in Reception to Y4. The program is designed to

encourage children to complete small amounts of maths homework on a regular basis. Parents are asked to help the children to log in to Doodlemaths but NOT help them answer the questions. Doodlemaths learns what the children are struggling with and tailors questions according to that. We still have a number of children telling us that parents have completed their Doodlemaths homework for them—this is then likely to set further questions for your child at a higher level than they are really capable of answering.

SWIMMING LESSONS RESTARTING

Swimming lessons will be restarting for Y2 and Y4 children on Tuesday. Please ensure that children come to school in the morning with their kit and have earrings removed.
