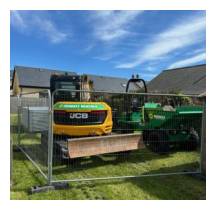

AND SO IT ALL BEGINS BUILDING WORK



As you may have seen from the construction vehicles parked near our playground, the work to construct the 2 additional classrooms to accommodate our Y5 and Y6 pupils is due to begin imminently. The building is due to be positioned on the other side of the path from the current fire exits out of the Y3 and Y4 classrooms. The access point to the school grounds for the construction work will be from the current exit onto Burton Road. We have a pre-start meeting next week that will give us more details about timescales and phases of the build. Parents are asked to carefully read any information that is sent out from school regarding accessing and exiting the school site safely and then follow this guidance carefully to help ensure the safety of everyone on site even if this means a slightly longer walk than usual. We will brief the children accordingly as well as giving them opportunities to get a closer look at the different phases of work that will be taking place.

A NEW APPROACH TO ENGLISH

In preparation for next year, we are currently trialling a new approach to English in Years 1-4. The children in these year groups have all been working on texts that they have never accessed before to gain a very deep understanding of the book alongside lots more grammar work accompanied by short burst writing task on a daily basis. The children are now being exposed to much more complex grammar at a younger age which we expect will prepare them even better for the rigorous expectations of Y5 and Y6.
