In school, our **Designated Safeguarding Leads (DSLs) are Mr Heeley and Mrs Cuthbertson** who you can also speak with about any concerns or worries for any pupils in our school. Our

Special Educational Needs /Disability Coordinator (SENDCO) is Mrs Smith who will be

happy to help you.

We are also very lucky to be able to offer the service of Jane Crudace, our School Nurse, who is able to help with a range of issues that children and parents may encounter such as sleep, eating, bedwetting, anxiety, and a range of other health/social issues. Any of these people can be contacted through the school office..

Class teachers are also always on hand to answer your queries but can also be contacted by email - their addresses are in children's homework books.

### OPERATION ENCOMPASS INFORMATION



Attached with this newsletter is a letter

detailing our school's involvement with Operation Encompass. Operation Encompass aims to support children and young people who are affected by domestic abuse. As a result, following any domestic abuse incident being reported to the police, the Police will make contact with Children's Social Care who will then communicate relevant and necessary information to nominated school staff. This will ensure that the school is made aware at the earliest possible opportunity and can subsequently provide support to children in a way that means they feel safe and listened to.
